All Patched Up

This will be the last newsletter article about Windows Vista for a while, so to finish things off we have decided to tell you what is needed to get Vista working on your network. Microsoft has released several patches to allow Vista to integrate into a SBS 2003 network like your Windows XP Pro machines.

The following list of installations are essential:

- Ripcurl Patch
- Vista OWA Patch
- ISA 2004 SP3
- Trend CSM 3.6

The Ripcurl patch installs on your SBS 2003 server, this allows your Vista clients to run the "connectcomputer" wizards that help join your Vista machine to the SBS Domain. Without the Ripcurl patch you need to connect your Vista machine like you would have traditionally completed in SBS 2000 & 4.5 days. This patch also allows Outlook 2007 to be configured as part of the connect computer wizard.

The Vista OWA patch allows your Vista machines to use Outlook Web Access, OWA allows users to read their email in a normal web browser from anywhere in the world. Vista looks at the OWA pages slightly different to the Windows XP machines, the server side web pages need to be updated to allow a new type of Active X control that Vista understands.

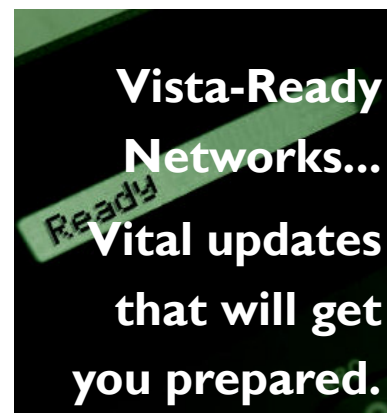
ISA Server 2004 also needs the latest service pack installed for Outlook 2007 to synchronise back to the main Exchange mailbox, ISA 2004 SP3 also includes other benefits like increased security, better troubleshooting tools and improved log viewer functionality

Trend CSM 3.6 is the new version of Trend's Antivirus, "That's Correct" over the past few months has featured write-ups about this new version and the benefits to you our clients, Without Trend 3.6 your Vista machines will not have Antivirus as the 3.5 version begins the install but does not complete, thus not offering you

protection.

the high cost of re-keying paper documents into their computer system, potentially freeing up staff for more productive activities. Why have sales people keying orders when they could spend that time generating revenue?

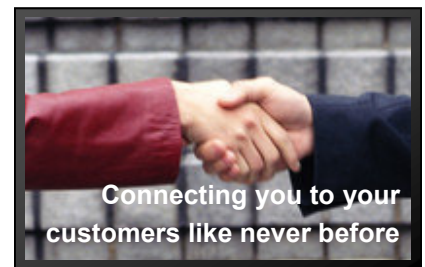
